

This project involved the construction and full fit-out of a new portal frame warehouse at Britvic's manufacturing facility in Rugby. This work included the construction of a roof-mounted plant deck, a cantilever canopy over a goods yard and a new toilet block. It also involved an M&E HVAC installation to enable a new production line. The project area was completely segregated from the surrounding facility whilst these works were being undertaken, which meant that our activities had no impact on Britvic's on-going operations.
